Programs include services for the homeless, medical and dental care for the working poor, charity dining rooms, thrift stores, a transitional housing shelter and general assistance for individuals in need.

### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL OF PHOENIX BY THE NUMBERS:

- 37.4 million** Meals served since St. Vincent de Paul, Phoenix opened in 1946.
  - 9.3 million** Pounds of food processed and sorted annually by St. Vincent de Paul's Food Reclamation Center.
  - \$8.9 million** Paid in homeless assistance and prevention programs.
  - 1.1 million** Meals prepared by St. Vincent de Paul annually.
  - 268,000** Hours donated by volunteers annually.
  - 20,000** Homeless families and individuals receive hygiene services – showers, toiletries, clothing, blankets and mentoring – through St. Vincent de Paul's Special Ministries.
  - 15,000** Annual patient visits to the St. Vincent de Paul Virginia G. Piper Medical and Dental Clinic, which provides healthcare for the working poor.
  - 157** People sheltered in one year's time at Ozanam Manor, a transitional shelter for people age 50 and above and the disabled.
  - 24** Students currently receiving tuition assistance and mentoring through the One at a Time Scholarship Program.
